TOURISM WITH A REGIONAL EDGE

Moldova is strengthening its tourism sector by linking workforce upskilling with cross-border cooperation.

ANTRIM signed a trilateral agreement with Armenia and Georgia, anchoring Moldova in regional tourism frameworks.

Two **familiarization tours (FAMs)** included Moldovan destinations, helping design multi-country packages.

ANTRIM developed a **hotel management software training module**, set to launch in 2025 as a sustainable income stream and tool to boost graduate employability.



Future potential includes expanding Moldova's visibility in Ukrainian, adventure, cultural, and wine tourism markets. ANTRIM's training model can also scale to digital marketing, guiding, and gastronomy, embedding systemic workforce development across the region.

DRIVING INCLUSIVE AND GREEN GROWTH IN ENERGY-EFFICIENT CONSTRUCTION

Partnering with Zugro LLC, the project piloted the country's first quadruple helix platform on Nearly Zero Energy Building (nZEB) standards, bringing together academia, industry, government, and civil society to accelerate regulation uptake and practical implementation.

Through the Women in Energy Moldova (WEM), RECONOMY is also strengthening the organizational capacity and advocacy role of women's networks in the green construction sector.

Launch of **Moldova's first nZEB quadruple helix dialogue platform**, driving cross-sector policy alignment.

Two editions of nZEB Days, advancing implementation efforts and creating regional exchange with Armenia and Georgia.

Direct contribution to **Moldova's National Plan for Increasing the Number of nZEBs by 2030** and new curricula at TUM's Faculty of Urbanism.

Zugro's technology expos triggered **early crowding-in**, with new insulation companies entering the market.

WEM developed a new strategy, business membership model, and began engaging in policy advocacy — including contributions to Moldova's **Deep Renovation Strategy 2050** on energy poverty.
