Design and Delivery of an Internal Learning Workshop on EU Accession Process

1. Introduction

HELVETAS Swiss Intercooperation, with support from the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), invites all interested and eligible applicants to submit their proposals in the field of accessing sustainable and green finance.

This opportunity is offered under the RECONOMY program—an inclusive economic development initiative operating across 11 countries in the Eastern Partnership and Western Balkans. In the Western Balkans, RECONOMY focuses on promoting inclusive and green economic opportunities for youth, women, and disadvantaged groups.

In partnership with the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), HELVETAS Swiss Intercooperation is leading a regional inclusive economic development program, RECONOMY, in 11 countries in Eastern Partnership (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Ukraine, Moldova), and the Western Balkans (Kosovo, Albania, Montenegro, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and North Macedonia). The program was launched in 2020 with the inception phase that ended for the Eastern Partnership countries in December 2022 and in March 2023 for the Western Balkans. The main phase is foreseen for four years, which started in January 2023 and will last till the end of December 2026.

2. Requirements

2.1 Technical Requirements

Technical Requirements should consider **Terms of Reference for “Design and Delivery of an Internal Learning Workshop on EU Accession Process”**, and other provisions of this Request.

3. Eligibility for participation

3.1 Eligible Applicants

Participation is open to all consultancy companies that are qualified and experienced in **designing and delivering learning Workshops on EU Accession Process**.

3.2 Exclusion Criteria from participation

Applicants shall be excluded from taking part in the procurement procedure if they meet at least one of the Exclusion Criteria described in Annex 1.

Applicants must certify on honour in their Proposals that they are not in any of the situations described in Annex 1 - Exclusion Criteria. Please use the template provided in Annex 2.

4. Selection Criteria

Eligible applicants meeting the following qualifications are invited to submit a proposal:

- At least 10 years of experience in designing and delivering training on EU accession process, including EU *acquis communautaire* and its chapters to the development organizations, state organizations, or similar actors.
- At least 5 years of experience and technical expertise of key experts (in-house or affiliated) to cover the scope of the assignment.
- Proven track record of consulting candidate countries or potential candidate countries on the accession process **is an advantage**.
- Good institutional understanding of political, economic and environmental context of the Western Balkan and Eastern Partnership countries, evidenced by a track record of implemented projects.
- Excellent analytical, report writing, and presentation skills of key experts.

5. Application Procedure

5.1 Documents to be submitted:

Proposals should include the following documents:

- Technical Proposal (as described in the ToR)
- Financial Proposal (as described in the ToR)
- Certification on Honour, (Annex 2)

Note: All the above-listed documents are mandatory for submission. If any of these documents are not presented, the proposal will not be qualified for the evaluation process.

5.2 Submission of Proposals

Proposals should be delivered to reconomyprocurement@helvetas.org, with the subject line "Workshop on EU accession process - RECONOMY Program", by **20 October 2025**.

6. Evaluation

Proposals shall be evaluated on the basis of their completeness, compliance, and responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other provisions of this Request for Proposals.

6.1 Awarding Criteria

Proposals shall be evaluated based on the **Best price – Quality ratio** criteria as follows:

- A. Technical Proposal - 70%
- B. Financial Proposal – 30%
